Visiting the park

The Nature Park can only be reached by sea. Tourist boats regularly provide collective transport from different ports in the Andratx and Calvià area to the island of sa Dragonera. It can also be reached by private boat.

The information centre in cala Lledó will provide you with instructions on how to enjoy a safe, relaxing visit. You will need to submit the number of visitors, where they are from and the purpose of the visit. Groups in excess of 10 people must have the prior authorisation of the park management.

The park is open every day of the year, including Sundays and public holidays, with the exception of days when stormy weather makes the sea too rough.

Rules Recommendations

Visitors are responsible for clearing up the waste they generate. In the event of an emergency: call 112.

When do you have to ask for permission?

- When your visit involves profit-making collective transport vessels.
- When your group has more than 10 people.
- When scientific research activity is involved.
- When leaving the marked routes.
- When you intend to film or take professional photographs.
- Every visitor is required to pay a park entrance fee (14-65 years of age).

What is prohibited?

- Entering the park outside visiting hours.
- Leaving the marked routes.
- Smoking, except in the pier area in cala Lledó.
- Lighting fires.
- Listening to music without headphones.
- Annoying animals and uprooting plants.
- Fishing from land.
- Feeding the animals.
- Bringing pets to the park, with the exception of guide dogs.
- Camping.
- Flying drones.
- Visiting or disembarking at the islet of Pantaleu.





European Goldfinch

Distinguishing features:
- A red mask, with black and white markings.
- It has a long beak with a fine tip and a wide base.
- Its tail is predominantly black.
Length: 12 cm
Wingspan: 21 - 25.5 cm



In nuptial period

Distinguishing features:
- A short beak.
- Its tail is long and low-cut.
- A brown back, a grey head and blackish wings.
- A striped throat and its two external tail feathers are white.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The male's forehead and chest are red during the spring.
Length: 13 cm
Wingspan: 21 - 25 cm



European Serin

Gafarró
Serín verdicillo
Serinus serinus



Distinguishing features:
- A short, wide beak.
- The tail has a marked notch at the end.
- A yellowish-white chest and a belly with short vertical stripes.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The male has a bright yellow forehead, throat and chest during the spring.
- The female is light brown in colour with darker markings.
Length: 11.5 cm
Wingspan: 20 - 23 cm



Spotted Flycatcher

Papamosques mediterrani/

Distinguishing features:
- A bulky head, a typical insectivore weak and thin, black legs.
- A greyish back, a whitish belly and a streaked throat, chest and forehead.
Length: 14 - 15cm
Wingspan: 23 - 25.5 cm



Common Redstart

Coa roja / Cotxa coa-roja
Colirrojo real
Phoenicurus phoenicurus



Distinguishing features:
- A predominantly brown back and a red tail.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The male has a reddish orange chest, a grey back, a black throat and a white forehead.
- The female has a greyish-brown underside and a browner back.
Length: 14 cm
Wingspan: 22 - 24 cm



Sardinian Warbler

Busqueret de capnegre/
Tallarol capnegre
Curruca cabecinegra
Curruca melanocephala



Distinguishing features:
- A dark hood that extends to below the eye.
- A red eye ring and pale legs.
- Its outer tail feathers are white.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The male has grey upperparts, paler underparts and a black head.
- The female has a browner back, with a paler belly and a grey head.
Length: 13 - 14cm
Wingspan: 15 - 18 cm



Balearic Warbler

Busqueret coalarg/
Tallareta balear
Curruca balear
Curruca balearica



Distinguishing features:
- It has a long tail.
- The back is slate-colored, the ventral parts are pale grey and the throat is whitish.
- It has a red eye ring and red legs.
Sexual dimorphism:
Females have a whitish throat and present the body with lighter grey tones.
Length: 13 cm
Wingspan: 13 - 18 cm



Blue Rock Thrush

Roquero solitario

Distinguishing features:
Sexual dimorphism:
- The male is dark blue.
- The female has a brownish grey upperside & a white spotted underside.
Length: 21 - 23cm
Wingspan: 33 - 37 cm

Peregrine Falcon

Falcó peregrí
Halcón peregrino
Falco peregrinus



Distinguishing features:
- Slate grey upperparts and slightly edges to the top feathers.
- Its under feathers feature a fine horizontal mottled pattern that extends to the wings.
- A powerful beak and a large moustache framing its white cheeks and eyes.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The female is bigger.
Length: 38 - 51cm
Wingspan: 89 - 113 cm



European Shag

Corb marí emplomallat/
Corb marí
Cormorán moñudo
Gulosus aristotelis



Distinguishing features:
Its neck is narrower than its head and its throat is totally black with yellow colouring the base of the beak.
- It has an upward curving crest during the mating season.
Length: 65 - 80cm
Wingspan: 90 - 105 cm



Eleonora's Falcon

Falcó marí / Falcó de la reina
Halcón de Eleonora
Falco eleonorae



Distinguishing features:
Adults with light plumage:
- A dark brown upperside.
- Striped reddish leg feathers and belly.
- Pale cheeks marked with a prominent moustache.
Adults with dark plumage:
- Completely black, brighter on the back with paler wing and tail light feathers.
Sexual dimorphism:
- The female is bigger.
Length: 35 - 44cm
Wingspan: 84 - 103 cm



Booted Eagle

Àguila calçada comuna/
Àguila calçada / Esparver
Àguila calzada
Hieraetus pennatus



Distinguishing features:
- Its wings are long and narrow.
- The tarsi are feathered until its talons grow.
- It has almost completely black wing feathers and a greyish tail.
- The belly features two different types of plumage that are unrelated to the bird's gender.
Light plumage: A white belly with a variable mottled throat and breast.
Dark plumage: A brown belly with a variable mottled throat and breast.
Length: 42 - 51cm
Wingspan: 110 - 135 cm



Osprey

Àguila pescadora
Pandion haliaetus



Distinguishing features:
- Very dark upperparts and white underparts with a spotted breast.
- A black mask behind the eye that runs along part of the neck.
Length: 53 - 66cm
Wingspan: 147 - 174 cm



Balearic Shearwater

Virot petit / Baldriga balear
Pardela balear
Puffinus mauretanicus



Distinguishing features:
- A small head and a fine greyish beak.
- Its wings and tail are relatively short, the legs usually protrude slightly behind.
- A brown upperside and belly and dirty white inner wings.
Length: 34 - 38cm
Wingspan: 83 - 93 cm



Scopoli's Shearwater

Virot gros / Baldriga cendrosa mediterrània
Pardela cenicienta
Calonectris diomedea



Distinguishing features:
- A robust, round head.
- A brown back with a scaly appearance and a white underside, except for the lower edge of its wings, which is dark.
- A yellowish beak with a dark tip.
Length: 45 - 56cm
Wingspan: 120 - 125 cm



Audouin's Gull

Gavina roja / Gavina corsa
Gaviota de Audouin
Ichthyaeus audouinii



Distinguishing features:
- Its back is light grey, while its belly, head and neck are pale grey.
- A darkish red, black and white coloured beak.
- Olive-coloured legs.
Length: 48 - 52cm
Wingspan: 127 - 138 cm



Yellow-legged Gull

Gavià / Gavina de potes grogues / Gavià argentat
Gaviota patiamarilla
Larus michahellis



Distinguishing features:
- Yellow legs, a yellow-orange beak with a red tip, and a red eye ring.
- A greyish back and a white belly.
Length: 55 - 67cm
Wingspan: 130 - 158 cm
